





These are only a FEW of the MANY insurance companies available.. TIP: Check with the insurance company to see if they offer pet insurance policy to bundle and save with your current policy!

REMEMBER...

Pet insurance companies generally cover emergencies, illness or injury, surgeries, hereditary or congenital conditions, cancer, medication, and chronic conditions. Some will also cover holistic or alternative therapies (chiropractic, acupuncture, etc).

No pet insurance company will cover preexisting conditions.

Most pet insurance companies will require you to pay for the entire invoice, then they will send you a reimbursement check after receiving your pet's claim form.







NAIL TRIMMING



Get your dog used to having their feet touched from an early age!

Use sharp nail clippers to cut the tips of each nail at a slight angle.

If you accidently cut into the quick, apply kwik-stop powder (or cornstarch or baking powder) and apply pressure.

Common Household Poisons



MEDICATIONS & SUPPLEMENTS

pain killers, cold medications, anticancer drugs, antidepressants, vitamins, diet pills

HOUSEHOLD CLEANERS, PESTICIDES, FERTILIZERS, AND POISONS

lawn chemicals and fertilizers, rat poison, antifreeze, citronella candles,



FOOD

chocolate, coffee, onions, garlic, raisins, grapes, avacados, and xylitol (common in gum)



PLANTS


english ivy,calla lily, jade, carnations, nightshade, daffodil

Signs of Dental Disease

The breath test


Sniff your pet's breath. Normal dog and cat breath isn't particularly fresh-smelling, but if it's especially offensive then it is a good idea to get them checked out by a vet.

The breath test

Once a week, lift the lips and examine your pet's gums and teeth. The gums should be pink not red. The teeth should be mostly white without large amounts of brown tartar.

Tooth decay

Bacteria and plaque can harden into tartar, possibly causing gingivitis, receding gums, and tooth loss



Recommended dental care products:

Dental wipes

Dental treats and chews

Dry dental diets

Oral rinses and water additives

LOOK FOR THE VOHC SEAL!



The VOHC seal (Veterinary Oral Health Council) is a badge of approval for pet dental products. When you see this seal on a product, it means that it has been tested and shown to help reduce plaque and tartar buildup on pets' teeth.
